
WAR EMERGENCY RADIO SERVICE

WAR EMERGENCY RADIO SERVICE OPERATOR PERMIT

This permit, when signed by the Secretary of the Commission and countersigned by the operator licensee, is valid for the duration of the war and six menths thereafter, but not more than five years from date of issuance, and authorizes operation only of stations of the herein named licensee, subject to the provisions of all applicable treaties, laws, orders and regular ions heretofore or hereafter enacted or promulgated.
