Eddie was age 19 and would be a grad of Cleveland Heights and was very active in the high school band. He started Dxing in 1934 when he heard Europe for the first time on his Majestic 8 tube receiver.

Little did we realize our subject would join the 82nd Air Borne - All American Division - and be in for the duration of WW2 as an Army Paratrooper.


