Blind Wisconsin Man Assembles Radio Set

La Crosse, Wis.—(P)—For six years Michael Mateske, blind, has been looking at the world through his radio transmitting and receiving set.

Despite his handicap Mateske assembled the units of his transmitter and has been working amateur stations in every state except Maine and Vermont. He copies messages on a machine that makes perforations in a tape. The messages are deciphered by touch.

Mateske is proficient in handling various types of transmitters, and has repaired sets.

In addition to operating station wars, Mateske-operates a store.
