**Andy Devine WB6RER \*1905-1977\*** Born in AZ moving to Kingman as a youngster. His raspy voice became his selling point, his speech was the result of a childhood accident. I loved him as Guy Madison's side kick "Jingles" in TV's Wild Bill Hickcock. Who can ever forget him as "Hap" in Flipper. He appeared in more than 400 movies and films and shared with Walter Brennan the rare ability to move with ease from B Westerns to A Pictures.

He was a star football player at Santa Clara University which led to his first film role in the silent "The Collegians." He expired at age 71.
