Many years ago I observed the Mobiliers Safety-Mike sales ads in QST Journal which only appeared a few times and usually wondered who was behind "The Headset Before its Time."

I was pleasantly surprised by the courtesy and assistance of two Coshocton Hams, N8VV Dan getting my request into motion and Steve AA8BN presenting me the data from the local Coshocton County Genealogical Society.

Forrest E. Hothem W8OVJ owned and operated a local small business in the beginning out of his basement in Coshocton. Mr. Hothem, a pilot and business man developed this much needed product that was light weight. It was designed, patented and manufactured by his small company beginning in 1960, with assistance from family and local help.

"For Hands Free" communication while flying and driving. For aviation, Public safety, Amateur and CB. There was also a version made for the Communic-Aid Company used by Laryngectomees to increase voice volume.

This Mobilier product was well received and advanced to aviation use. Lafayette Radio and Electronics offered this item also in their mail order catalogs. Sales were interstate and international to Canada, Japan, Brazil and Australia. Sadly the product was phased out in 1978 after a good run and the local Richard Downing Airport became Forrest's third base. (last stop before home) Mr. Hothem (W8OVJ) expired in 1983. Survived by wife Jean; son Robert and brother Robert Hothem of Brownsville TX. We thank W8CCA Coshocton County Amateur Radio Assn., in appreciation for their generosity helping write this article. Coshocton has been radio active for a very long time!
